The Alameda County Probation Department (ACPD) is excited to announce the launch of their *Wall* of *Success* Initiative.

The initiative was introduced by Antonio Gomez via Alameda County Probation Department's Virtual Suggestion Box portal. The Wall of Success will serve as a testament that the ACPD lives up to its mission of restoring communities by providing compassionate supervision, accountability to justice-involved youth and adults, providing preventative rehabilitative services through evidence-based practices and collaborative partnerships.

The Wall of Success is a repository of human impact stories that fosters client motivation, by showcasing client stories that illustrate what it means to "lead by example" and honoring the fundamental belief that people can change.

The displays will be located at the headquarters of the five probation divisions. There will be a ribbon cutting ceremony that will take place in Juvenile Hall on April 7th in conjunction with the "National Day of Hope".

The staff-led initiative is comprised of ten committee members representing a cross-sector of ACPD among each of its divisions, whom have been working on the project over the last three months.
