

SB 823 Timeline of Events



Statute Review

Welfare and Institutions Code Section 1995(a)

To be eligible for funding described in Section 1991, a county shall create a subcommittee of the multiagency juvenile justice coordinating council, as described in Section 749.22, to develop a plan describing the facilities, programs, placements, services, supervision, and reentry strategies that are needed to provide appropriate rehabilitation and supervision services for the population described in subdivision (b) of Section 1990.



Statute Review cont.

Welfare and Institutions Code Section 1995(e)

In order to receive 2022-2023 funding pursuant to Section 1991, a plan shall be filed with the Office of Youth and Community Restoration by January 1, 2022. In order to continue receiving funding, the subcommittee shall convene to consider the plan every third year, but at a minimum submit the most recent plan regardless of changes. The plan shall be submitted to the Office of Youth and Community Restoration by May 1 of each year.



Schedule of Plan Submissions

- The subcommittee shall convene to consider the plan every third year
 - 2022 – Initial plan submitted December 2021
 - 2023 – Updated plan submitted April
 - 2024 – Plan due May 1
- Convene 2025 – Plan due May 1
- Convene 2028
- Convene 2031
- Convene 2034



Committee Composition

Welfare and Institutions Code Section 1995(b)

The subcommittee shall be composed of the:

- Chief Probation Officer, as Chair
- District Attorney's Office
- The Public Defender's Office
- The Department of Social Services
- The Department of Mental Health
- The County Office of Education or a school district
- Representative from the court



Committee Special Requirements

The subcommittee shall also include no fewer than three community members who shall be defined as individuals who ***have experience providing community-based youth services, youth justice advocates with expertise and knowledge of the juvenile justice system or have been directly involved in the juvenile justice system.**
