

SB 823 Plan Requirements



SB 823 Plan Mandates (WIC 1995)



SB 823 requires local jurisdictions to develop a plan to address the DJJ Realigned population and specifies the elements which must be included in each plan

Target Population

Describe the following:

- County's realignment population
- Facilities, programs, placements, services and service providers, supervision, and other responses that will be provided



Juvenile Justice Realignment Grant Funds

Describe how the County plans to apply grant funds to address:

- Mental health, sexual offender treatment, or related behavioral or trauma-based needs of the target population
- Support programs or services that promote healthy adolescent development for the target population
- Family engagement in programs
- Reentry, including planning and linkages to support employment, housing and continuing education
- Evidenced-based, promising, trauma-informed and culturally responsive services
- Services or programs that are provided by nongovernmental or community-based providers
- Regional agreements or arrangements



Facility Plan



Describe the following:

- Plans to house or confine youth at varying levels of offense severity and treatment need
- Improvements to accommodate long-term commitments
- Ensure safety and protection of youth having different ages, genders, special needs, and other relevant characteristics

Retaining Youth in the Juvenile Justice System



Describe how the county will do the following:

- Incentivize or facilitate the retention of youth within the jurisdiction and rehabilitative foundation of the juvenile justice system, in lieu of transfer to the adult criminal justice system

Describe the following:

- How data will be collected on youth served
- Outcome measures that will be utilized to determine the results of the programs and interventions






